¡Hola a todos! Welcome to the MFL department at Castle Hall Academy. We are all very much looking forward to meeting you all and teaching you Spanish when you join us.

There are many Spanish speaking countries in the world some of which you may have visited. It is the official language of the following Spain (including the Canary and Balearic Islands) , Argentina, Ecuador, Mexico and 15 + other countries.

There are more than 450 million native speakers of Spanish, making it second only to Chinese in terms of the most spoken languages in the world. Spanish is the third most studied language in the world, after English and French.

In addition to the 450 million native speakers, just shy of 75 million people around the world speak Spanish as a second language.

When learning Spanish at CHA you will not only learn how to communicate in Spanish but you will learn about countries where the language is spoken, the food, culture, sports and famous people from that country.
